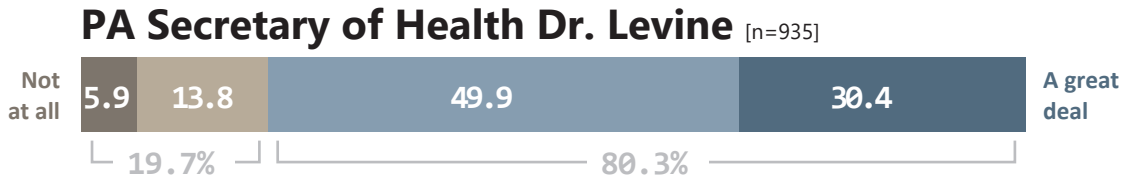


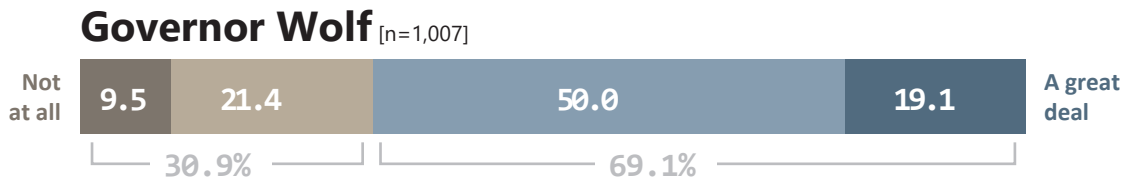
COVID-19 Report Series: Trust in Public Officials Amid Coronavirus

A majority of Pennsylvanians trust their state officials over federal officials to deliver coronavirus information.

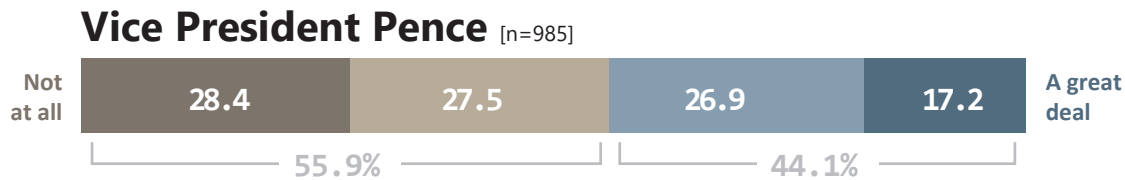
Trust Scale: **not at all** | **not very much** | **a good amount** | **a great deal**



More likely to trust *a great deal*: Democrats, Age 65 and Over

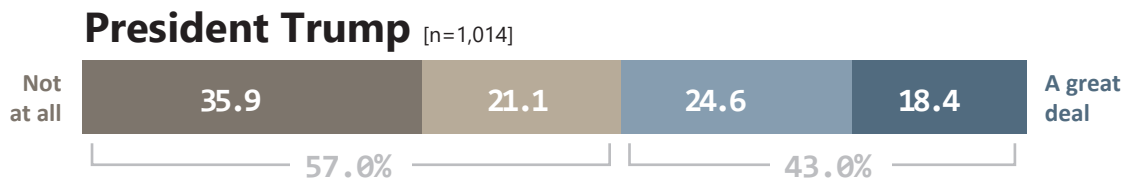


More likely to trust *not at all*: Men, Republicans



More likely to trust *a great deal*: Republicans, Age 35 and Over

More likely to trust *not at all*: Democrats, Black/African Americans



More likely to trust *a great deal*: Republicans, Age 35 and Over, Veterans

Less likely to trust *a great deal*: Black/African Americans

More likely to trust *not at all*: College-Educated, Democrats

Excludes respondents who answered "Don't know / Not sure". Data were collected from 1,047 adult Pennsylvanians via web from April 6 - April 16, 2020. Margin of Error: ± 3.0% with 95.0% Confidence
