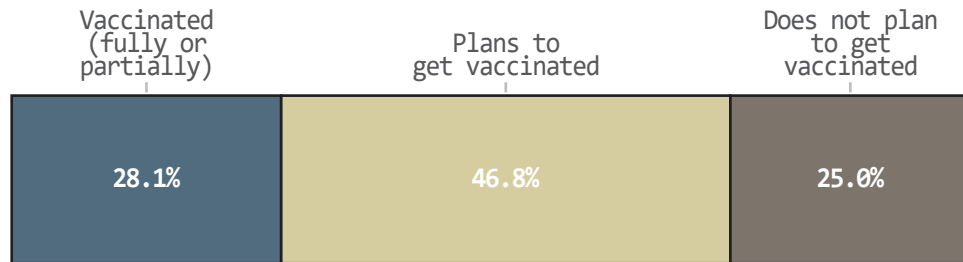


Despite the state's vaccine efforts, a quarter of Pennsylvanians do not plan to get vaccinated against the coronavirus.

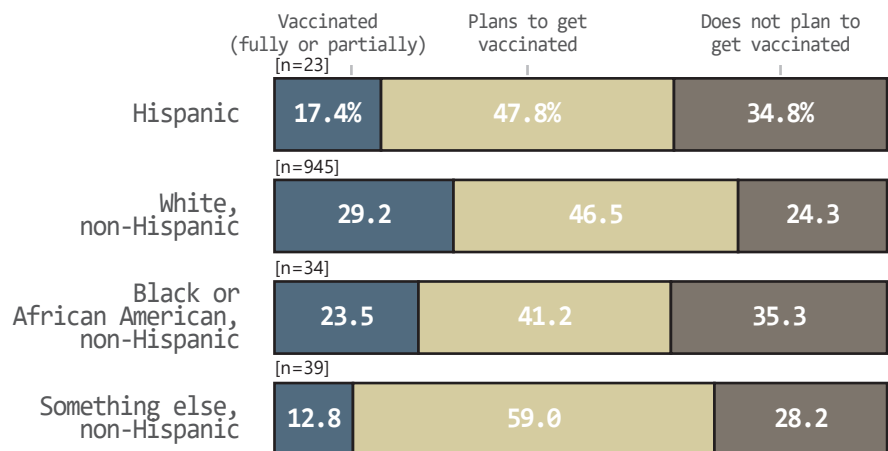

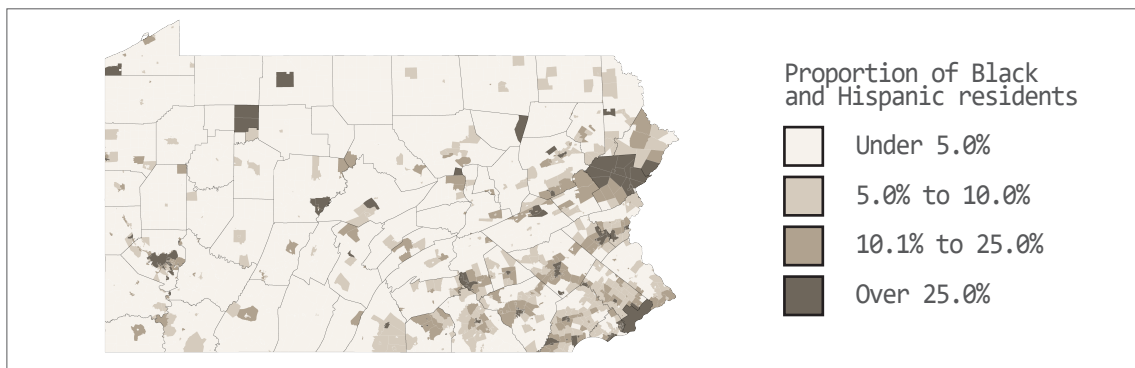

Black and Hispanic respondents were the least certain about getting the vaccine.



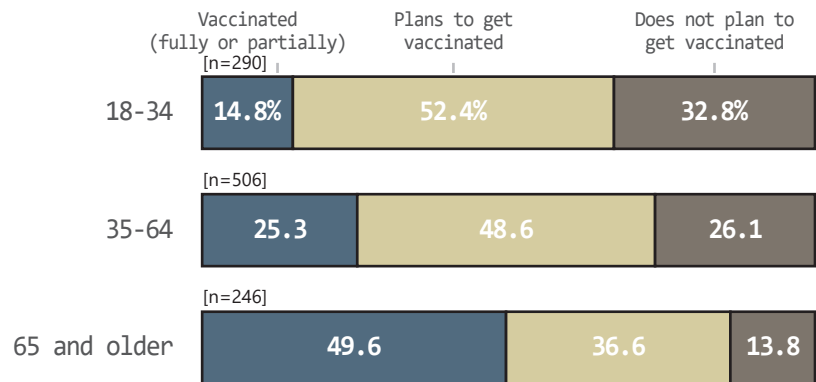

Older Pennsylvanians were the most certain about receiving the coronavirus vaccine.

Only 13.8% of respondents 65 and older indicated that they did not plan to get vaccinated.



Residents of the Northwest, Northeast, and Southcentral Department of Health regions were the most reluctant to get the vaccine.

Almost a third of respondents in these three regions did not plan to get the vaccine.
