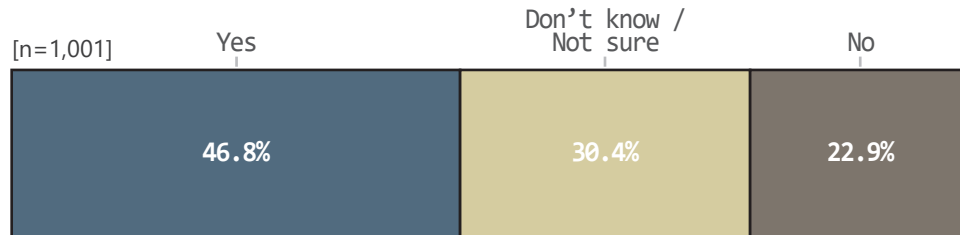


Less than half of Pennsylvanians plan to get vaccinated against the coronavirus.

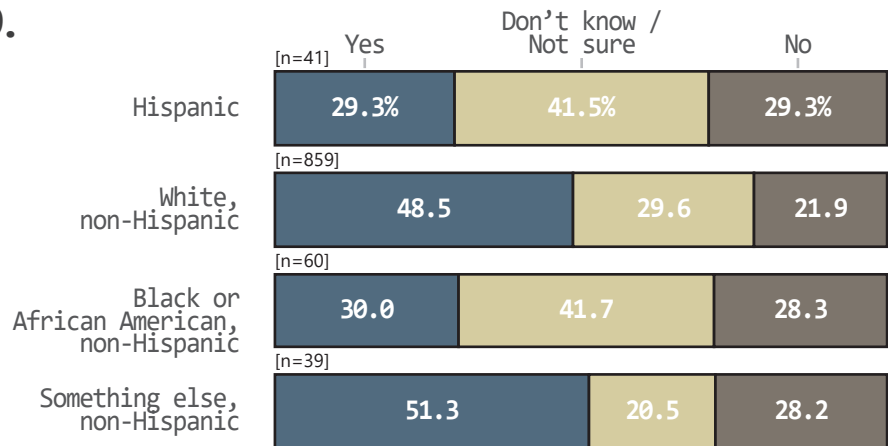
If and when a coronavirus vaccine becomes available, will you get vaccinated?



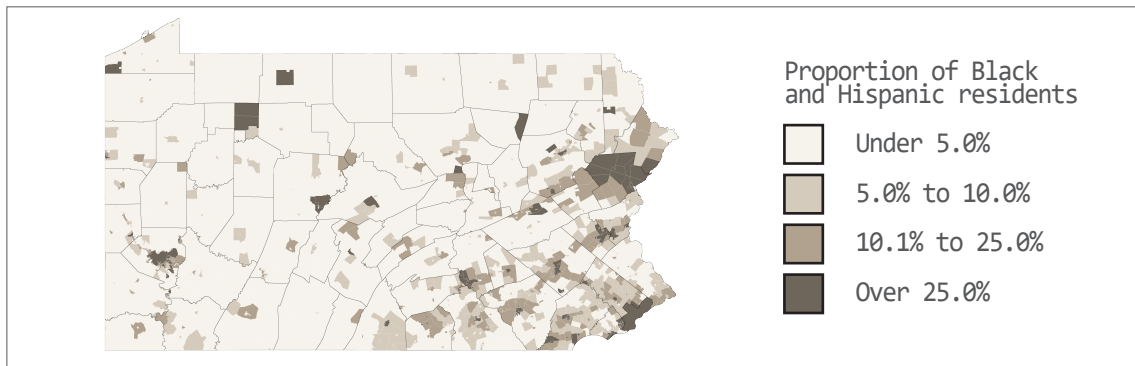

Differences in respondents' willingness to get vaccinated may put communities of color at risk to experience long-term effects from COVID-19.

Black and Hispanic respondents were the least certain about getting the vaccine.

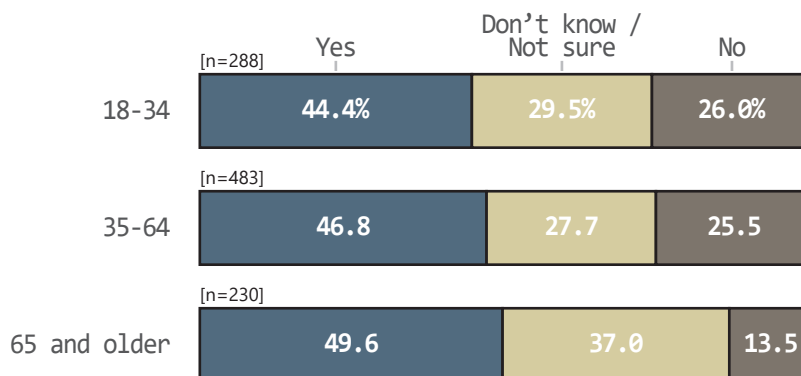


Note: Excludes respondents who did not report race/ethnicity



Older Pennsylvanians were the most certain about receiving the coronavirus vaccine.

Only 13.5% of respondents 65 and older indicated that they did not plan to get vaccinated.



Residents of the Northwest, Northcentral, and Southcentral Department of Health regions were the most reluctant to get the vaccine.

Almost a third of respondents in these three regions did not plan to get the vaccine.
