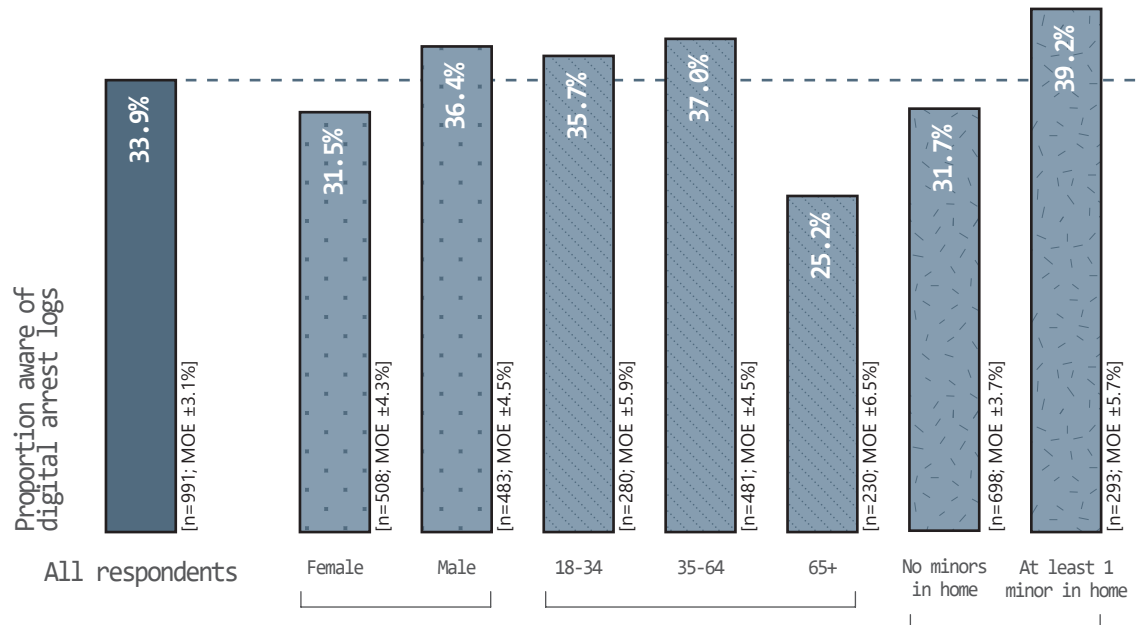

## One-third of Pennsylvanians surveyed said they were aware that police departments publish digital arrest logs.

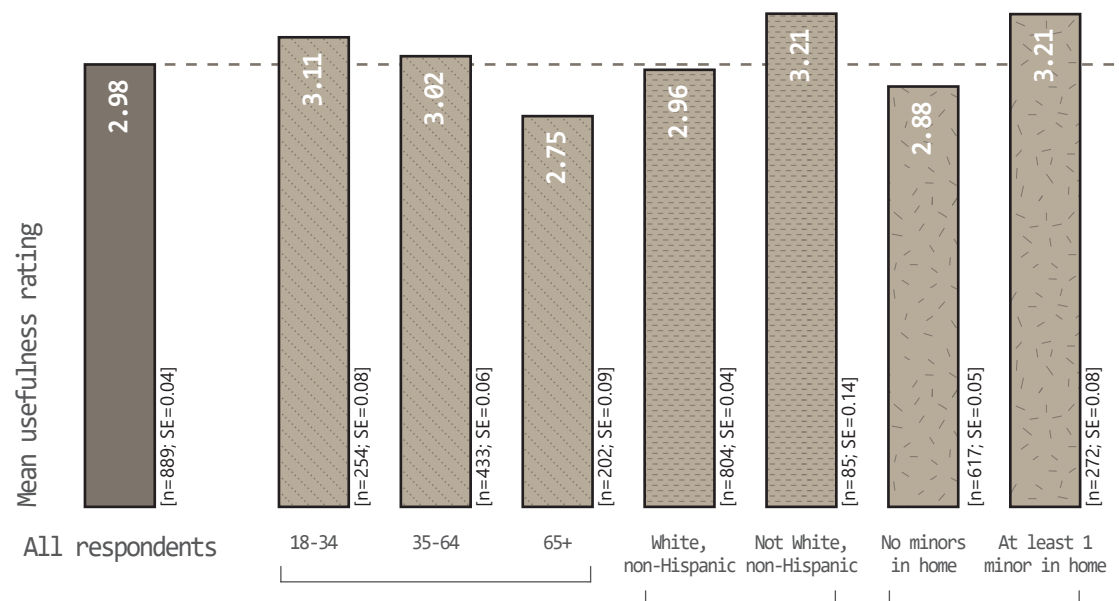
*Males, respondents younger than 65, and respondents with at least one minor in the home were most likely to be aware of digital arrest logs.*



## In general, digital arrest logs were regarded as moderately useful.

Scale: 1="Not at all useful" to 5="Extremely useful"

*Younger respondents, those of a minority race/ethnicity, and those with at least one minor in the home were most likely to say that digital arrest logs were useful.*



Note: Data were collected from 1,044 adult Pennsylvanians via web from February 23 to April 20, 2021. Excludes respondents who answered "Don't know".
